

As a result of The Police and Fire Reform (Scotland) Act 2012 Scotland now has a new country-wide Police Scotland Service and Scotlish Fire & Rescue Service.

The Act gives local authorities responsibility for scrutinising and reviewing the Glasgow Police, Fire & Rescue and Safer Communities plans. In Glasgow, this will be carried out by the Safe Glasgow Group, a structure within the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership, performing this role on behalf of Glasgow City Council.

The Safe Glasgow Group involves representatives from:

- Glasgow City Council 10 Elected Members
- · Glasgow Community Health Partnership
- Glasgow Housing Association
- Police Scotland
- Scottish Fire & Rescue Service

The priorities set out in the interim plans for both services have been approved by the Glasgow City Council and the Glasgow Community Planning Partnership. Over time the priorities will develop and adapt to reflect the findings of continuous community engagement.

The Safe Glasgow Group members will build on and strengthen the close connections between the Police, Fire & Rescue Service and the communities they serve.





Community events - have your say

To enable local communities to have their say, an event will be held in each ward to:

- Publicise the role of the Safe Glasgow Group
- Inform residents of the interim plans for both Police Scotland and the Scottish Fire & Rescue Service
- · To gain feedback from residents on these plans and

The events will include an introduction by an Elected Member.

This will be followed by presentations and workshops from Police Scotland; Scottish Fire & Rescue Service; Glasgow Housing Association and Glasgow Community & Safety Services about their local plans and the community issues they face.

These events will give residents a chance to meet with officers from the agencies represented on the day and allow residents to talk about their local safety concerns
